FUTURE LAWYERS

The Future Lawyers pathway has been specially designed to prepare our students for a future career in the field of law. Students who chose this elective, will receive expert careers advice, guidance, and application support from a range of legal employers and solicitors.

Students will also gain practical experience of the legal system through court visits, work experience opportunities, mock trial competitions and Mootings! In addition to gaining a valuable insight into how the legal system operates, these experiences can also be used to enhance future university or apprenticeship applications. Through our wide range of university links, students can also access bespoke one to one support with both Oxbridge applications and LNAT tests.

FUTURE MEDICS

The Future Medics programme has been designed to support our students with a successful application to medicine, veterinary or dentistry courses.

Students will have the opportunity to meet online with applicants from across the Consortium, to support each other through the application process. They will benefit from guest speakers, advice on finding suitable work experience placements, and support with their applications and the interview process. In addition to providing them with support, these experiences will also further enhance their university applications.

FUTURE TEACHERS

The Future Teachers programme has been designed to support our students who hope to follow a career path into the educational field.

Students will have the opportunity to meet with current teachers (both experienced as well as those who are new into the profession), as well as trainee teachers who are currently on placements in schools. There will be guest speakers from Hull University and YWTT (our local ITT provider) as well as the opportunity to participate in work shadowing and work experience placements in schools. In addition to gaining a valuable insight into how the education system operates, these experiences can also be used to enhance future university or apprenticeship applications.
